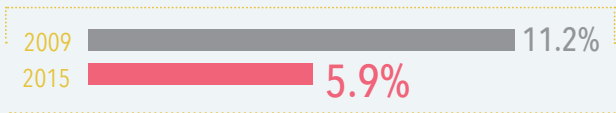

One of the lowest rates of uninsured Delaware has seen

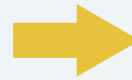
## Access to Care

**5.9%** Uninsured Residents

**9th lowest rate of uninsured residents** in the country, down from 33rd

## Young People

**30** Behavioral health consultants in middle schools, up from zero at the start of the Administration



**1,000+**

Cases opened to help kids

Increased state funding for nurse home visits for new mothers and babies as way to **reduce infant mortality and increase healthy mothers and babies.**

Delaware is now a national leader in providing home visits per capita.

Increasing access to key substance use treatments



## New Laws to Save Lives

Expanded the use of the overdose-reversing drug naloxone in the community and **empowered law enforcement agencies to use to save lives**

**September 2015**  
First report of someone reversing a loved-one's overdose

Signed **Good Samaritan Law** ensuring those who call to report an overdose are not at risk for arrest for low-level drug crimes

## Community Care

**↑92%** Medicaid-eligible Delawareans receiving home and community-based services.

**↓11%** Reduction in spending on public long-term care facilities  
**88%** of individuals referred to public long-term care diverted to the community

At \$100,000 per person for nursing home care, the shift annually saves **\$27.2 Million**

## State Health Care Innovation Plan

### Improve Quality and Lower Costs

Projected to create more than \$1 billion in cost-of-care savings through 2020

Expect More
